

NORTHERN ADVENTURE: FISHING BIG



The facility is located on the island Sørøya, approx. 100 km to the north of Alta. Sørøya is considered a fairly large island, situated far enough from the mainland to have plenty of fish in the waters surrounding it. The location is perfect for anglers who are planning to do some serious fishing! For those who are not satisfied with tiny fish, but want to wrestle the really big whopper. You can catch big fish all year. Most common catch is cod, but also saith, wolfish and halibut.

You can stay in a summer house, in an apartment or at the hotel. The full service hotel is centrally located at Hasvik, just a stone's throw away from the ferry terminal and airport. The summer houses are traditional Norwegian houses decorated by Northern Norwegian standards, with nature as the next door neighbor. All houses are within walking distance from the nearest port, with their own private outdoor area. The apartment complex is perfect for large groups. Up to 24 people can stay under the same roof, distributed on 4 apartments. All housing units have a TV set with a channel package and wireless internet.

Accommodation price includes rental of 1-2 motorboats (19 feet, 50 HP). It is also possible to arrange a fishing trip with a captain/guide on a larger boat perfectly suited for 4-6 persons. You can also book a private fisher guide for your fishing on a motorboat.



PRICES:

Housing: 30 000 – 40 000 NOK per 1 week for 1 unit for 6 people, including rental of 2 19-foot aluminium motorboats with an outside 50 HP engine.

Fishing tour with captain: from 7500 NOK for 6 hours. Rental of equipment is extra.

Local English speaking guide/fishing instructor: from 2700 NOK for 6 hours.

HOW TO GET THERE:

By plane: from Oslo via Tromsø to Hasvik (Hasvik lufthavn). Hasvik airport is within walking distance from the houses, about 10 minutes.

By car: car ferry connects Hasvik on Sørøya with Øksfjord on the mainland, 2-4 departures per day.

If the exceptional fishing is not enough, what else can you do: fresh water fishing, nature walks and mountain hikes, guide tour to Kvithellhula cave, guided tour around Sørøya, local food, cooking with a local chef.
